I still remember sitting at the kitchen table with the list of names of everyone in the class and a couple of boxes of valentine cards. We were all expected to give everyone in the class a Valentine card. Some years, the card simply folded over other years they had separate envelopes. One of the best years, only the back of the card needed addressing and signed, because a lollipop went through the card. I know that I probably asked why we had to have a card for everyone.

I also remember the hard work of getting my children through this process, too. The slow process of finding the right packs of cards – cool enough, but also fitting their personalities. Then the torture of having to write that many names.

This process may have been more reflective of the love expressed in 1 Corinthians 13 than all the romantic dinners ever have been. This text, often called the "Love Chapter," is thought of when planning weddings, but not for the everyday living out of our lives. It sounds right for the kind of love necessary for a strong marriage. However, that sugar coats this passage and minimizes the responsibility living love as a lifestyle. Paul did not write it for couples. He wrote it to a congregation struggling to live with diversity and opinions and real people.

If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. 2 And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. 3 If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing.

⁴Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant 5 or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; 6 it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. 7 It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

It is easy to reflect on how Daryl and I have exhibited this kind of love as we celebrate our anniversary. We wouldn't still be married if we hadn't shared some of this kind of love. We've both needed to offer the other forgiveness and patience and to decide that somethings aren't as important as the love we have for each other. This month, I challenge us not only to think about love for Valentine's Day but also to think about what it means to have love as a lifestyle. It is harder to reflect on the news, this being Black History Month, or the disparity between the haves and have-nots. Yet, the kind of love Paul describes calls us to consider what actions love might take in the face of threats of war, political grandstanding, racial diversity, and poverty. I think one of the keys is that this kind of love is willing to seek out truth and to still have hope. God offers us a generous love. May this be the kind of love that we offer others. Peace,
